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Dear Airport Owner,

Through this letter Airservices is implementing a data quality assurance process for receipt of aeronautical information, as required of it by Civil Aviation Safety Regulation (CASR) Part 175 (Aeronautical Information Management).

In April, CASA and Airservices wrote to all aerodrome operators published in the Australian AIP Enroute Supplement Australia (ERSA) regarding the implementation of CASR Part 175.

The implementation information below is provided to guide aerodrome operators in the use of the Airservices Data Product Specifications (DPS). Use of the DPS provides assurance that information published on behalf of aerodrome operators by Airservices has a high level of integrity and reliability.

Some aerodrome operators will seek to have their annual review of published AIP/ERSA information combined with their annual technical inspection/survey using the DPS format. The DPS has been designed to be consistent with contemporary requirements for accuracy and resolution. The DPS also incorporates NOTAM handling aspects.

Airport staff authorised to make changes to AIP/ERSA and/or NOTAM must be first registered with Airservices for those functions and a registration form is provided.

Airservices through this letter requests you to review your published information now, register with Airservices your nominated personnel, implement and use the DPS for any future changes.
