Background	The Hawaiian Airlines group has been purchased by the Alaska Air Group which is the parent company of Alaska Airlines. Call signs will shortly change; however, aircraft markings will remain as Hawaiian Airlines until they can be transitioned.		
For controller information	From 29 October 2025, Hawaiian Airlines will be changing its callsign from Hawaiian/HAL to Alaska/ASA, for example, HAL451 (Hawaiian 451) will become ASA451 (Alaska 451). The Hawaiian Airlines aircraft will continue to operate with Hawaiian Airlines markings and per AIP, pilots should specify this on first contact with terminal ATC units. AIP GEN 3.4 5.17.2 Pilots flying an "interchange" or "leased" aircraft, not bearing the normal colours/markings of the company operating the aircraft, should inform the terminal ATC facility (on first contact) of the name of the operating company and aircraft callsign, followed by the company name as displayed on the aircraft, and aircraft type, e.g. VELOCITY THREE ELEVEN, AIR NEW ZEALAND INTERCHANGE (or LEASE), BOEING SEVEN FOUR SEVEN.
